EDUCATIONAL GOALS

This training will contextualize eating disorders within the lives, experiences, and overall health needs of transgender, nonbinary, and intersex communities. The training will go beyond the introductory level and is most suitable for those who already have a basic understanding of sex and gender diversity and transgender identities. In addition to reviewing the importance of affirming language and terminology, the training will provide a framework for understanding eating disorders in transgender, nonbinary, and intersex populations as an intersectional social justice issue.

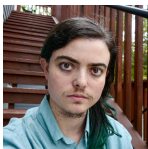

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

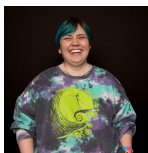
Participants will be able to:

- Understand at least 4 systemic factors that influence, complicate, and increase the development of eating disorders in transgender, nonbinary, and intersex people.
- Learn the 3 categories of transitions transgender and nonbinary people may go through.
- Name the 3 types of gender euphoria.
- Identify at least 4 considerations for treating and diagnosing trans, nonbinary, and intersex individuals who are experiencing both body dysmorphia and gender dysphoria.
