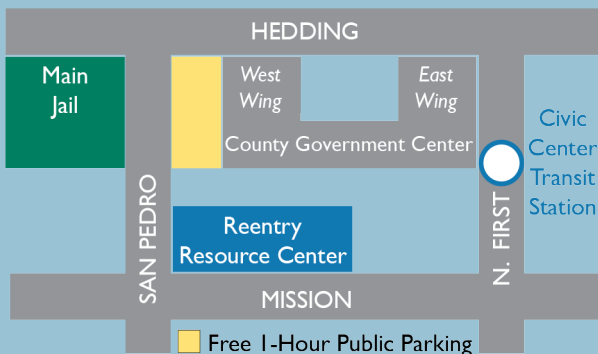
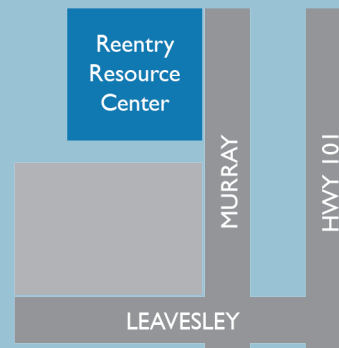

### Behavioral Health Services Department:

The Behavioral Health Services Department is available at the SJ RRC for mental health and substance use assessment and referral and outpatient substance use treatment (SUTS) services **Mon.-Fri. 8am-5pm**. Peer mentors with lived experience are available to provide support, guidance, DMV vouchers and connection to RRC services and community resources. Individuals recently released from prison or jail and on Post Release Community Supervision (PRCS) or Mandatory Supervision should call the RRC AB 109 Probation Assessment Team at **408-535-4244**. Individuals released to the Custodial Alternative Supervision Unit (CASU), the Electronic Monitoring Program (EMP), or the Sheriff Work Program (SWP) report to the RRC unless directed otherwise.
