FORMAL NOTICE OF STATEWIDE DIRECT PRIMARY ELECTION
JUNE 7, 2022**

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that on June 7, 2022, a Statewide Direct Primary Election will be held in the County of Santa Clara and the offices for which candidates may be nominated are listed below.

Also, pursuant to Elections Code Section 10400, such election may be either completely or partially consolidated.

Voter-Nominated Offices to be Elected are:

Governor and Lieutenant Governor

Qualifications: Be a U.S. citizen; be a registered voter and otherwise qualified to vote for that office at the time that nomination papers are issued to the person; not have been convicted of a felony involving accepting or giving, or offering to give, any bribe, the embezzlement of public money, extortion or theft of public money, perjury, or conspiracy to commit any of those crimes; not have served two terms in the office sought since November 6, 1990. **Term of Office:** 4 years, commencing January 2, 2023.

Secretary of State, Controller, and Treasurer

Qualifications: Be a registered voter and otherwise qualified to vote for that office at the time that nomination papers are issued to the person; not have been convicted of a felony involving accepting or giving, or offering to give, any bribe, the embezzlement of public money, extortion or theft of public money, perjury, or conspiracy to commit any of those crimes; not have served two terms in the office sought since November 6, 1990. **Term of Office:** 4 years, commencing January 2, 2023.

Attorney General

Qualifications: Be a registered voter and otherwise qualified to vote for that office at the time that nomination papers are issued to the person; have been admitted to practice before the California Supreme Court for a period of at least five years immediately preceding their election to the office; not have been convicted of a felony involving accepting or giving, or offering to give, any bribe, the embezzlement of public money, extortion or theft of public money, perjury, or conspiracy to commit any of those crimes; not have served two terms in the office sought since November 6, 1990. **Term of Office:** 4 years, commencing January 2, 2023.

Insurance Commissioner

Qualifications: Be a registered voter and otherwise qualified to vote for that office at the time that nomination papers are issued to the person; not have been convicted of a felony involving

accepting or giving, or offering to give, any bribe, the embezzlement of public money, extortion or theft of public money, perjury, or conspiracy to commit any of those crimes; during tenure of office, not be an officer, agent, or employee of an insurer or directly or indirectly interested in any insurer or licensee under the California Insurance Code, except (1) as a policyholder, or (2) by virtue of relationship by blood or marriage to any person interested in any insurer or licensee; not have served two four-year terms in the office sought. **Term of Office:** 4 years, commencing January 2, 2023.

Member, State Board of Equalization, District 2

Qualifications: At the time nomination papers are issued: 1) be a registered voter, and; 2) be otherwise qualified to vote for the office if the person was a resident of, and registered to vote in, the election district from which the office is elected; not have been convicted of a felony involving accepting or giving, or offering to give, any bribe, the embezzlement of public money, extortion or theft of public money, perjury, or conspiracy to commit any of those crimes; not have served two terms as a Member of the State Board of Equalization since November 6, 1990. **Term of Office:** 4 years, commencing January 2, 2023.

United States Senator

Qualifications: Every candidate shall be at least 30 years of age, a U.S. citizen for nine years, and a resident of California on January 3, 2023, the date to be sworn into office if elected. **Term of Office:** 6 Years (one seat termed), commencing January 2, 2023.

United States Senator (Partial Term)

Qualifications: Every candidate shall be at least 30 years of age, a U.S. citizen for nine years, and a resident of California on the date to be sworn into office if elected. This special vacancy election is for the remainder of the unexpired term in the United States Senate, which ends on January 2, 2023.

United States Representatives in Congress for Districts 16, 17, 18, and 19

Qualifications: Every candidate shall be at least 25 years of age, a U.S. citizen for seven years, and a resident of California on January 3, 2023, the date to be sworn into office if elected. **Term of Office:** 2 years (52 Representatives), commencing January 2, 2023, at 12:00 noon.

State Senate, District 10

Qualifications: Be a U.S. citizen; at the time nomination papers are issued: 1) be a registered voter, and; 2) be otherwise qualified to vote for the office if the person was a resident of, and registered to vote in, the election district from which the office is elected; not have been convicted of a felony involving accepting or giving, or offering to give, any bribe, the embezzlement of public money, extortion or theft of public money, perjury, or conspiracy to commit any of those crimes; serve no more than 12 years in the State Senate, the Assembly, or both, in any combination of terms during their lifetime if they were first elected to the

Legislature after June 2012 and they have not previously served in the State Senate or Assembly; not have served two terms in the State Senate since November 6, 1990, if they were elected to the State Senate before June 2012; not have served three terms in the Assembly since November 6, 1990, if they were elected to the Assembly before June 2012. **Term of Office:** 4 years (40 members – 20 to begin every two years), commencing December 5, 2022, for 20 even-numbered Senate districts.

Member of the Assembly, Districts 23, 24, 25, 26, 28, and 29

Qualifications: Be a U.S. citizen; at the time nomination papers are issued: 1) be a registered voter, and; 2) be otherwise qualified to vote for the office if the person was a resident of, and registered to vote in, the election district from which the office is elected; not have been convicted of a felony involving accepting or giving, or offering to give, any bribe, the embezzlement of public money, extortion or theft of public money, perjury, or conspiracy to commit any of those crimes; serve no more than 12 years in the State Senate, the Assembly, or both, in any combination of terms during their lifetime if they were first elected to the Legislature after June 2012 and has not previously served in the State Senate or Assembly; not have served two terms in the State Senate since November 6, 1990, if he or she was elected to the State Senate before June 2012; not have served three terms in the Assembly since November 6, 1990, if he or she was elected to the Assembly before June 2012. **Term of Office:** 2 Years (80 members), commencing December 5, 2022.

Superintendent of Public Instruction

Qualifications: Be a registered voter and otherwise qualified to vote for that office at the time that nomination papers are issued to the person; not have been convicted of a felony involving accepting or giving, or offering to give, any bribe, the embezzlement of public money, extortion or theft of public money, perjury, or conspiracy to commit any of those crimes; not have served two terms in the office sought since November 6, 1990. **Term of Office:** 4 Years, commencing January 2, 2023.

Non-Partisan Offices to be Elected are:

Judge of the Superior Court, Office Nos. 1 – 25

Qualifications: The candidate must be a citizen of the United States, a registered voter, a member of the State Bar for ten years or have served as a judge of a California court of record for ten years immediately preceding the election. Documentation which is considered acceptable for establishing the qualifications for candidates includes, but is not limited to certificates, declarations under penalty of perjury, diplomas, and/or official correspondence. Documentation or a declaration under penalty of perjury must be filed at the time nomination papers are issued. **Term of Office:** 6 years, commencing January 2, 2023.

County Supervisor, District 1 & District 4

Qualifications: The candidate must be a registered voter and resident of the district for at least 30 days preceding the deadline for filing nomination documents and during term of office. Also, may not serve in the same office for more than three consecutive terms. **Term of Office:** 4 years, commencing January 2, 2023.

Assessor

Qualifications: The candidate must be a registered voter of the county. If elected must meet Government Code Section 24002.5, which states, “No person shall exercise the powers and duties of the office of assessor unless he or she holds a valid appraiser’s certificate issued by the State Board of Equalization pursuant to Article 8 (commencing with Section 670) of Chapter 3 of Part 2 of Division 1 of the Revenue and Taxation Code. Documentation which is considered acceptable for establishing the qualifications for candidates includes, but is not limited to certificates, declarations under penalty of perjury, diplomas, and/or official correspondence. Documentation or a declaration under penalty of perjury must be filed at the time nomination papers are issued. **Term of Office:** 4 years, commencing January 2, 2023.

District Attorney

Qualifications: The candidate must be a registered voter of the county at the time nomination documents are issued and has been admitted to practice in the Supreme Court of the State. Documentation which is considered acceptable for establishing the qualifications for candidates includes, but is not limited to certificates, declarations under penalty of perjury, diplomas, and/or official correspondence. Documentation or a declaration under penalty of perjury must be filed at the time nomination papers are issued. **Term of Office:** 4 years, commencing January 2, 2023.

Sheriff

Qualifications: The candidate must be a registered voter of the county at the time nomination documents are issued. At the time of the final filing date for election meets one of the 5 requirements per Government Code Section 24004.3, which states, “(1) An active or inactive advanced certificate issued by the Commission of Peace Officer Standards and Training. (2) One year of full-time, salaried law enforcement experience within the provisions of Section 830.1 or 830.2 of the Penal Code at least a portion of which shall have been accomplished within five years prior to the date of filing and possess a master’s degree from an accredited college or university. (3) Two years of full-time, salaried law enforcement experience within the provisions of Section 830.1 or 830.2 of the Penal Code at least a portion of which shall have been accomplished within five years prior to the date of filing and possesses a bachelor’s degree from an accredited college or university. (4) Three years of full-time, salaried law enforcement experience within the provisions of Section 830.1 or 830.2 of the Penal Code at least a portion of which shall have been accomplished within five years prior to the date of filing and possesses an associate in arts or associate in science degree, or the equivalent, from an accredited college. (5) Four years of full-time, salaried law enforcement experience within the provisions of Section 830.1 or 830.2 of the

Penal Code at least a portion of which shall have been accomplished within five years prior to the date of filing and possess a high school diploma or the equivalent.” Documentation which is considered acceptable for establishing the qualifications for candidates includes, but is not limited to certificates, declarations under penalty of perjury, diplomas, and/or official correspondence. Documentation or a declaration under penalty of perjury must be filed at the time nomination papers are issued. **Term of Office:** 4 years, commencing January 2, 2023.

NOTICE IS GIVEN that the Declaration of Intention filing period for Judges begins on January 31, 2022 and must be filed with the Registrar of Voters’ Office no later than 5:00 p.m. on February 9, 2022.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that the nomination documents, including a Declaration of Candidacy, for eligible candidates desiring to file for elective office may be obtained from the County of Santa Clara Registrar of Voters’ Office, 1555 Berger Drive, Building #2, San Jose, California, 95112. The nomination filing period will begin on February 14, 2022 and must be filed with the Registrar of Voters’ Office no later than 5:00 p.m. on March 11, 2022.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that all active registered voters will automatically be mailed a Vote-by-Mail ballot package beginning on May 9, 2022; the Vote Centers for said election will be open starting on May 28, 2022, through June 6, 2022, for varying hours of operations. Please see our List of Vote Centers hours of operation posted on our website at <https://www.sccvote.org/>. The Vote Centers will be open on Election Day, June 7, 2022, from 7:00 a.m. until 8:00 p.m. All ballots cast in said election will be counted centrally at the County of Santa Clara Registrar of Voters’ Office, 1555 Berger Drive, Building #2, San Jose, California.

NOTICE IS ALSO GIVEN that, pursuant to Elections Code Section 15101(b), Vote by Mail ballots will be opened and processed for counting beginning May 9, 2022, at the County of Santa Clara Registrar of Voters’ Office, 1555 Berger Drive, Building 2, San Jose, California.
