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Executive Summary

Inmar Rx Solutions, Inc (“Inmar”) was fully approved to operate a Safe Drug Disposal Stewardship Program (“Plan”) on August 30, 2023 pursuant to the County of Santa Clara Safe Drug Disposal Stewardship Ordinance Number NS-517.91 (“Ordinance”) and the Safe Drug Disposal Regulations (“Regulations”). This Annual Report is for the Reporting Period between May 21, 2023 and May 20, 2024. The following information contained within this Annual Report mirrors the requirements outlined in Regulation Section 8. Capitalized terms used herein are the same as those used in Inmar’s approved Plan dated February 5, 2021 as revised August 25, 2023.

Inmar’s focus for the third year of operation was to increase unwanted drug collection and program promotion. Inmar completed these tasks by working with Drop-Off Sites to organize tailored collection schedules to eliminate Drop-Off Site closures due to full collection receptacles. Inmar hosted several drug take-back events in coordination with local Household Hazardous Waste (“HHW”) events throughout Santa Clara County. Inmar enhanced program promotion by offering a variety of digital and traditional promotional campaigns throughout the Reporting Period.

Educational Efforts and Public Outreach

Regulation § 8 (A)(iv) - Description of the Promotion System and how it has been implemented, including a summary of efforts to achieve the metrics set forth in Section 7 - Promotion System Marketing Plan

- 75% at a 3+ Frequency for the duration of one month at least three times per year over the first twelve months of Stewardship Plan operation
- 50% at a 2+ Frequency for the duration of one month at least three times per year for the following years; and
- 75% at a 3+ Frequency for the duration of one month at least three times per year for every fifth year of program operation

Inmar and the other Program Operator created a single system of promotion for promotional and outreach activities in Santa Clara County. The Single System of Promotion (“SSP”) includes a common logo, proposed creation and implementation of a neutrally-branded website and toll-free phone number, and a royalty-free license for Inmar to use the other Program Operator’s kiosk signage and intellectual property.

Inmar and the current County approved Program Operator worked together to establish a neutrally-branded website, www.med-projectsantaclara.org, and toll-free phone number 844-482-5322, in the Required Languages which went live in February 2024. Inmar promoted the Inmar-branded website, www.safemedicinedrop.com, and phone number until the neutrally-branded site went live. Additional outreach activities were conducted during the reporting period with the goal of meeting promotion requirements as outlined in Section 8 (A) of the Regulations. These activities consisted of four influencer campaigns, two digital programmatic campaigns, one radio campaign, and one newspaper ad campaign. The dates and results of these campaigns are listed in Appendix B.

I. Outreach Materials

Inmar will work with all approved Stewardship Plan Operators to provide easily-consumable educational materials for dissemination to interested parties including Residents, pharmacists, retailers, and health care practitioners upon request and at no charge. All materials will be easily understandable by interested parties with varying levels of English proficiencies and will leverage explanatory graphics to aid in comprehension. Materials are available in Required Languages.

These materials will:

- Provide instruction on how to safely store covered drugs at home
- Inform of the risks of disposing of Unwanted Covered Drugs in inappropriate waste streams (e.g., solid waste collection, sewer, or septic systems)
- Outline how to participate in the safe disposal of Unwanted Covered Drugs.

II. Traditional Media

Inmar has a system in place that allows us to efficiently deploy local media using traditional tactics for general program awareness. Below are details broken out by medium that cover recommended placements to reach the required target audience awareness.

A. Radio

Radio ads provide efficient media coverage across a broad geographic area while simultaneously providing connection to the local community with known local announcers. Radio offers a frequency that reinforces messaging with listeners and drives consumer action. Different station formats offer a way to reach different target audiences. Inmar will utilize San Francisco radio station KOIT 95.6 FM (“KOIT”) to provide information on safe drug disposal throughout the listening area. KOIT is consistently one of the top stations in the Bay Area radio market. Messaging will also run simulcast across streaming platforms. The utilization of KOIT radio ads have the potential to reach over 3

million impressions during a one month period. Advertisements will focus on providing education on safe drug disposal and will emphasize that safe drug disposal options are free to all County residents. Inmar will consider running ads on additional radio platforms in Santa Clara County if reach and frequency standards are not met.

B. Print Ads

Newspapers are one of the most trusted media formats and provide local news within a specific community. Inmar will run full-color ads in various sizes in local newspapers for four week frequency intervals on Sundays to maximize consumer exposure. Sunday insertions reflect the highest circulation day. Inmar will run ads in additional publications in Santa Clara County promoting the neutral website, www.med-projectsantaclara.org, in subsequent program years.

III. Digital Media

A. Programmatic Media

Programmatic Media provides targeted display and/or video ads on browser sites on internet capable devices (smart phones, computers, tablets, etc.). Additionally, geo-targeting can be used to focus the ads to specific areas within proximity to a kiosk if needed to increase awareness in underserved areas or in areas that need additional outreach. Inmar will run ads across a prequalified list of over 200K domains including a variety of retail websites, Google, and Facebook. The programmatic targeted ads will run twice a year for the six weeks leading up to the DEA's National Prescription Take Back Days in April and October. Impression metrics are reported directly from the individual websites that the ads are placed on and are reported on a per campaign basis.

B. Influencer Marketing

Influencer Marketing is a content creation tactic used to drive awareness and education to a targeted audience through blogs and social media outlets. Influencers create original content around their everyday lives and interests while weaving the story of prescription drug take-back into their content. Influencer content is converted into paid ad units across social platforms and then targeted to community members across Santa Clara County. Paid advertisements for influencer content will be run on a variety of platforms including Google and Facebook and will drive towards a specified impression or reach goal. Inmar will run several social media influencer campaigns concurrently with other traditional and digital media campaigns. Influencer campaigns to include one campaign every quarter.

Safety or Security Concerns

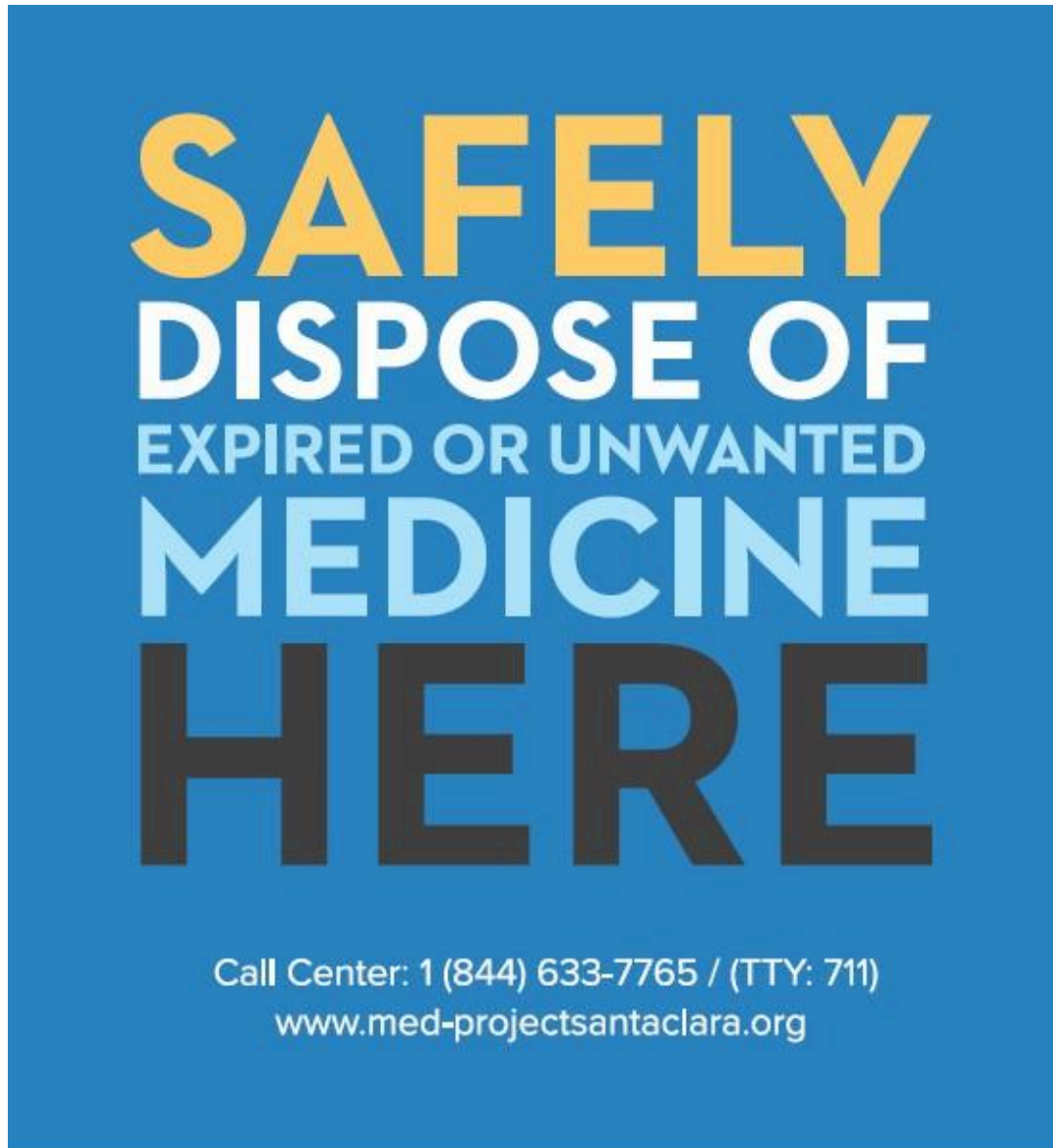


Figure 1 - Sample Promotional Signage

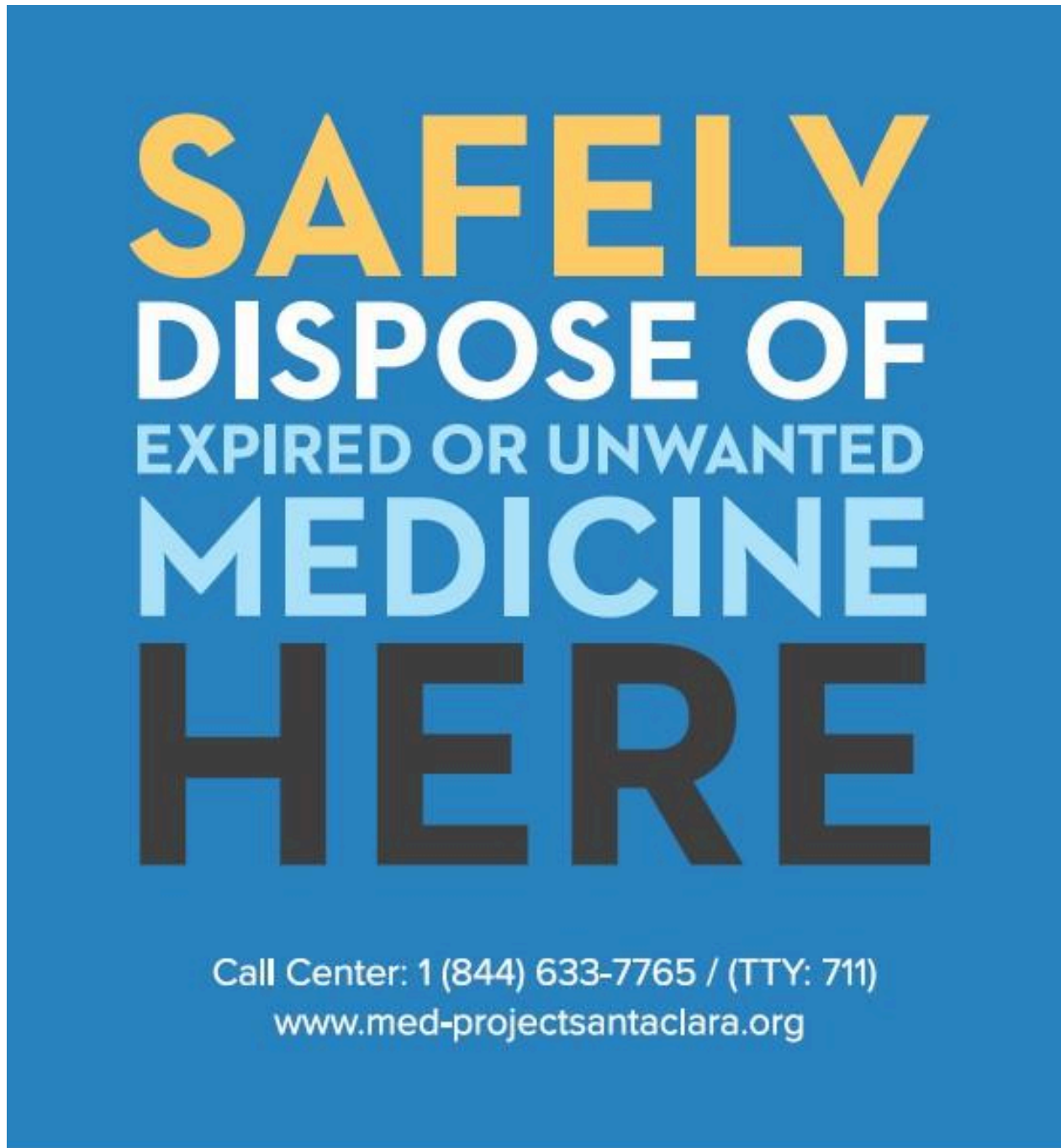


Figure 2 - Sample Promotional Signage for Standard Mail-Back Distribution Sites

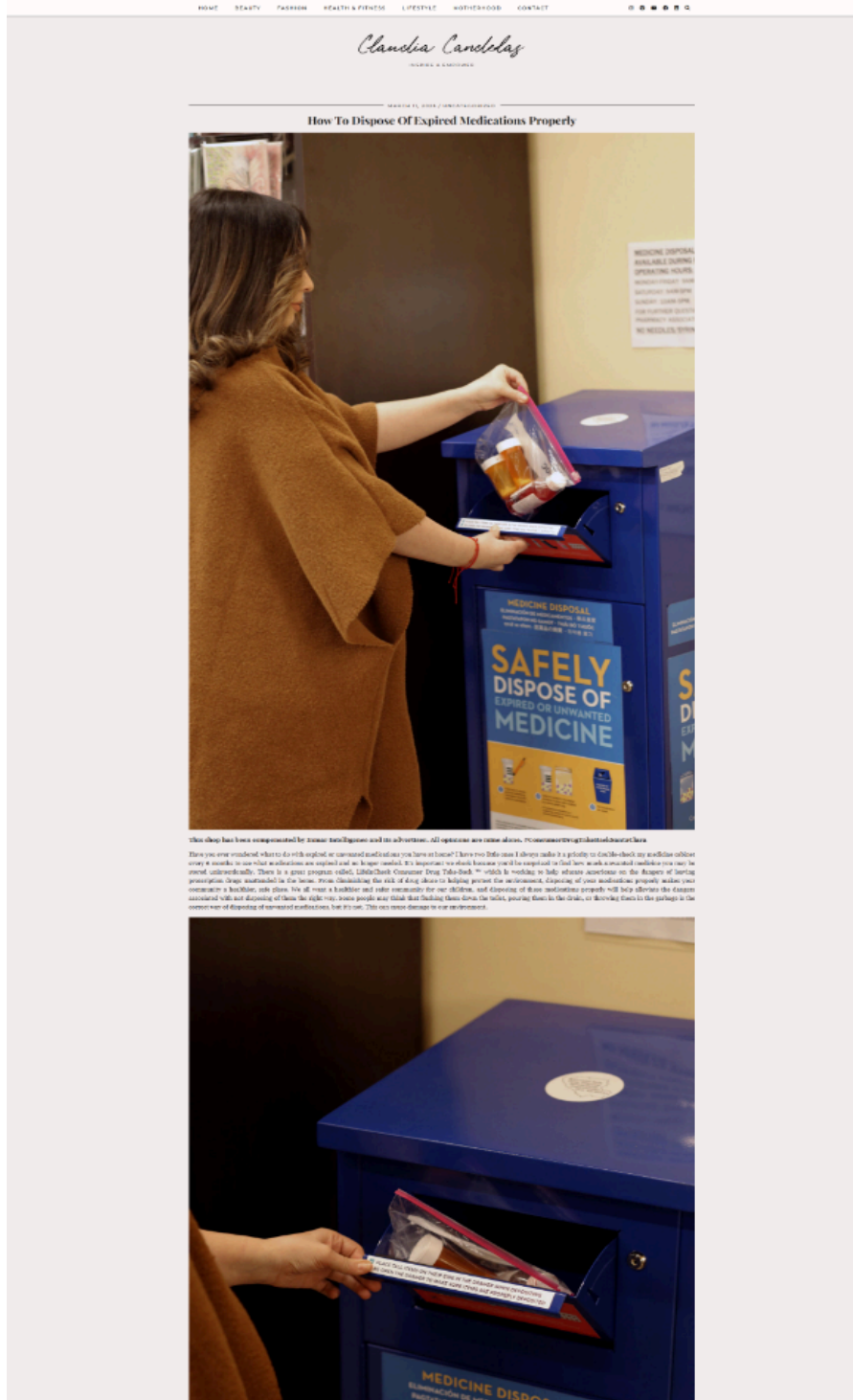


Figure 2 - Sample from Q3 2023 Influencer Campaign

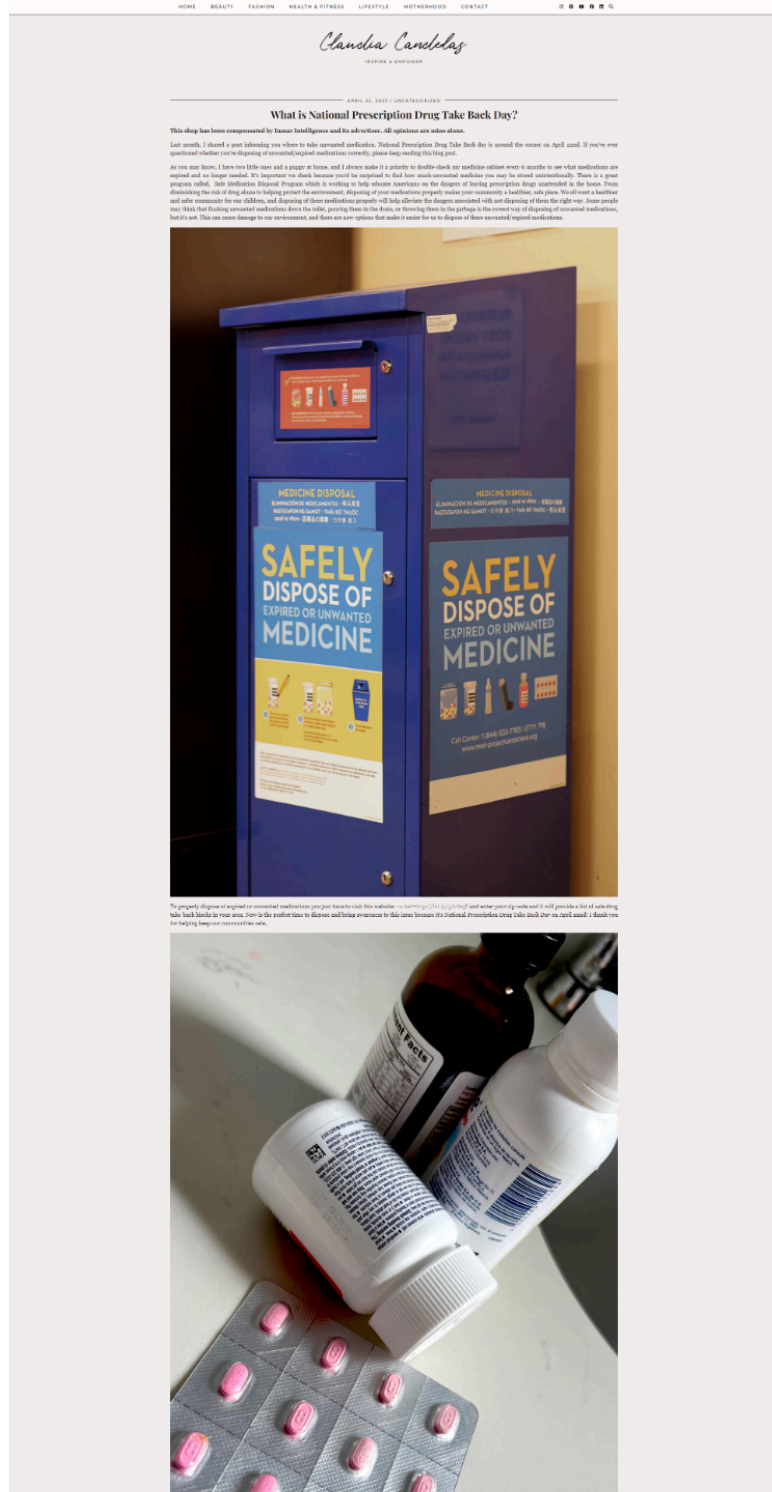


Figure 3 - Sample from Q4 2023 Influencer Campaign

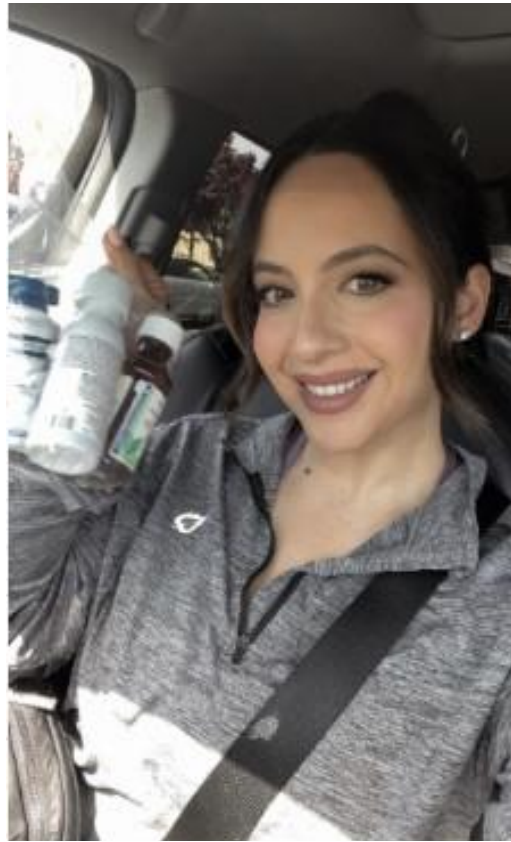


Figure 4 - Sample from Q1 2024 Influencer Campaign
