With climate change only projected to worsen over the coming decades, the County has developed the Community Climate Roadmap 2035 to accelerate efforts to **reduce greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions** from community activities and help contribute to GHG reduction on a statewide and national scale. The roadmap uses community outreach and public feedback to **present key implementation strategies and actions** to reduce GHG emissions in unincorporated areas of Santa Clara County, and coordinated strategies that **pool resources and leverage partnerships with cities, public agencies, and partners countywide** to reduce countywide GHG emissions.
