

## Status of Items Identified in June 23, 2020 Board Referral

RECOMMENDATION		STATUS
1	Requiring officers to intervene to stop another officer from using excessive force.	Implemented
2	Restricting or prohibiting the use of chokeholds, strangleholds, carotid restraints, and other approaches that cut off a suspect's air supply or blood flow.	Implemented
3	Requiring officers to de-escalate situations to the greatest extent possible before using force, and to train officers specifically in de-escalation and violence reduction strategies.	Implemented
4	Updating use of force policies to more clearly represent the maximum level of force allowable in response to specific types of conduct.	Implemented
5	Requiring officers to give a clear verbal warning before using deadly force.	Implemented
6	Prohibiting officers from shooting at moving vehicles unless an individual in the vehicle poses a direct deadly threat by means other than the vehicle.	Implemented
7	Requiring officers to exhaust all other reasonable alternatives before resorting to deadly force.	Implemented
8	Requiring comprehensive reporting of both all uses of force and all threats of force.	Implemented
9	Compliance with new standards, guidelines and training on use of force (SB 230).	Implemented
10	Compliance with new standards, guidelines and training on use of force (AB 392).	Implemented
11	Prohibiting the hiring of enforcement and correctional officers with a history of excessive force or misconduct complaints.	In Process
12	Making public a list of all lethal and less-lethal armaments currently owned.	Implemented
13	Limiting the acquisition of "military-style" weaponry and equipment.	Implemented
14	Banning or limiting the use of tear gas as a crowd control technique.	No Commitment to Implement

15	Restructuring County emergency response to ensure that the County employees best trained and suited to handle a given situation are able to do so.	In Process
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
