Ramp Speed Limit

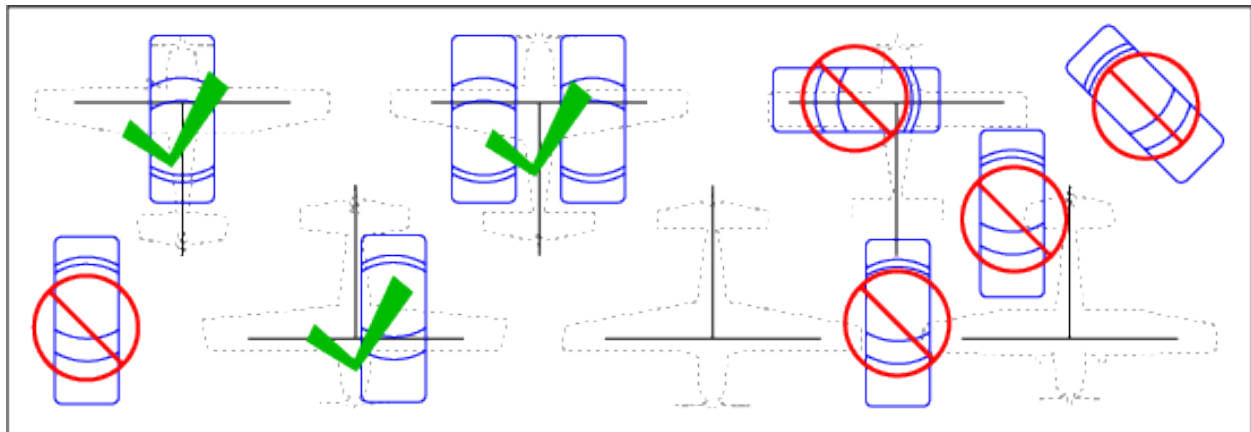
As spelled out in the Rules and Regulations, the speed limit on the parking ramp is 15 M.P.H. That goes for all wheeled vehicles. For the safety of everybody, please keep the speed down.



Auto Parking

Your tie-down and shelter parking space are only intended for the storage of your plane. Your license agreement to park an airplane at the airport does not include the right to store an automobile, trailer, RV or anything else on the parking ramp. If you need storage for an extra car, truck, trailer or RV, you are welcome to come by the office and sign up for an appropriate parking space. We currently charge \$8.00 to \$25.00 per day or \$78.50 to \$245.00 a month, depending upon the size of your vehicle.

When you drive to the airport, you are expected to park your car at one of the designated auto parking spaces at the end of the hangar rows. If you wish to leave your car at the airport while you travel in your plane, you are expected to park your car on your tie-down or shelter space or park your car in your hangar. Each tie-down and shelter space can accommodate two automobiles without interfering with any other parking spaces. If you have additional guest cars, please check in with the Operations Office and they will issue a free parking permit for the lot near the terminal. Below you will find a diagram showing the authorized ways to park your vehicle on the aircraft parking ramp and in the shelter area.



Failure to follow these guidelines may result in your vehicle incurring transient parking fees, or being towed and impounded.

Maintenance Request

Do you have a maintenance request for your hangar, see a runway light this is out, FOD on the taxiway you would like addressed? Please enter any maintenance request using MaintStar, our service request tracking system. You can get to it on our website, CountyAirports.org, by clicking *Facility Repair Request* under the Tenants tab.

MaintStar provides work order tracking for many municipalities and different departments within the County. To ensure your request gets routed to us at the airport, please ensure you are logging into the system from the link on our website.

End of Late Fee Waiver

Because of the economic challenges associated with COVID-19 and the resultant shut-down, the County stopped charging late fees. Beginning October 1, 2021 we will again institute late fees for all accounts that are not paid in full by the due date.

Please remember that your payments are due by the 1st of each month but we provide a grace period of 10 days intended to ensure any payments in the mail reach us before your account is considered delinquent.

Hangar Repair

The hangars on P & Q Row at RHV that were damaged by an intoxicated driver are scheduled for repair. The delay in repair was the result in a difference in expected repair costs between the county insurance carrier and the contractor. Those difference have been resolved and construction should start in the near future.

Runway Signage at RHV

The County is working with a vendor to finalizing a contract to replace runway and taxiway signage at Reid-Hillview Airport. The project is being funded by a \$1,000,000 loan from Santa Clara County General Fund. Once construction begins it is expected to take approximately four months and should be completed during the spring of 2022.
