Presidential General Election - Insights

- In person voting started on October 5
 - Record numbers of voters coming in early and in person at the ROV
- Vote Centers opened Oct 31 Nov 3
- Added drop box pick ups
- ▶ 2020 vs. 2016
 - 853,410 ballots in 2020
 - 724,596 ballots in 2016
 - 1,025,347 registered voters
 - ▶ 875,176 registered voters
- Still processing and curing ballots



Vote Centers

- Close to 60,000 voted at Vote Centers (VC) in the 4 day period (100 VC) March had 62,000 that voted at Vote Centers which were open 11 days (110 VC)
- Safety protocols at Vote Centers
 - Masks required
 - Limited staff/voters inside, 6 ft social distancing
 - Gloves, hand sanitizers, offered.
- Return trained courier and Vote Center Staff from March
- Field instructors assigned to sites to assist hands on
- Online videos and e-mail bulletins to assist Vote Center staff
- No Vote Center was short staffed, voters were enthusiastic to volunteer!



Vote By Mail

- Record number of Vote by Mail ballots returned
- Drop boxes were used more than USPS mailboxes
- Voters voted early
 - March 30,000 ballots returned at E+1
 - November- 7,125 returned at E+1
- Early ballots = early report of counted ballots



- Over 400,000 reported to Secretary of State by 8:00 on Election Day
- Executive Order
 - ► E-29 vs. E-14
 - ► E+3 vs. E-14
