
POWER Update: October 2022



- Children of color are overrepresented in our child protection system
- Consider helping patients and families connect with <u>First Call</u>, a county resource intended to prevent at risk families from referral to CPS.
- Reflect on the difference between poverty and neglect and consider how many referrals to CPS are initiated due to lack of resources.
