Ryan White HIV/AIDS Program

The Ryan White HIV/AIDS Program provides a comprehensive system of HIV primary medical care, essential support services, and medications for low-income people living with HIV. The program funds grants to provide care and treatment services to people living with HIV to improve health outcomes and reduce HIV transmission among hard-to-reach populations

The Ryan White Program was named after an Indiana teen who was diagnosed with AIDS at the age of 13 and gained national attention. Ryan White became the face of public education about HIV. The Ryan White CARE Act was passed in August 1990, four months after his death.

Eligibility Criteria

To be eligible for the Ryan White Program, you must meet the following requirements:

- Have a diagnosis of HIV or AIDS;
- Live in Santa Clara County;
- Meet all financial qualifications.

The Ryan White Program is not an insurance plan or an entitlement. Services can only be provided to the extent that funding is available. The Ryan White Program is the "Payer of Last Resort" meaning if you are eligible for any other programs or providers with the same services, Ryan White Program funding cannot be used. Services for eligible clients are free and provided regardless of immigration status.

Ryan White Program Services

Service	Offered By	Details
Case Management Services <i>Medical and Non-Medical</i>	The Health Trust (THT)	Includes <u>screening and enrollment</u> in the Ryan White Program. Provides advice and assistance in obtaining services related to your health needs. For more complicated needs, medical case managers can assist in developing an individualized service plan, coordinating medical treatments, providing treatment adherence counseling, and ensuring continuity of care.
Food Services	The Health Trust	Access to a food bank, home delivered groceries, or delivery of prepared meals.
Emergency Financial Assistance	The Health Trust	Provides help in cases of unexpected and urgent financial needs.
Medical Transportation	The Health Trust	Access to tokens or monthly passes for public transportation for clients with a need.
Housing Services	The Health Trust	Provides assistance in getting or keeping stable housing.
Outpatient Care Services	PACE Clinic	Includes routine and specialized care provided by health care professionals to help maintain your health.
Mental Health Services	PACE Clinic	Specialized psychological and psychiatric treatment for individuals with a diagnosed mental illness.
Substance Abuse Services	PACE Clinic	Specialized treatment of drug or alcohol abuse disorders, including screening, assessment, and diagnosis.
Oral Health Services	Onsite Dental (Access through THT)	Includes preventative and restorative care provided by dental health professionals to help maintain good dental hygiene.
Early Intervention Services	Positive Connections Program	Provides case planning and coordination for individuals newly diagnosed with HIV or not currently in care. (408) 792-5080 www.SCCPositiveConnections.org
AIDS Drug Assistance Program (ADAP)	CA Dept of Public Health (Access through THT or PACE Clinic)	Provides FDA-approved medications to low-income individuals living with HIV/AIDS who have limited or no coverage from private insurance or Medi-Cal/Medicare.
Testing Services	Crane Center	Provides STD, HIV, Hepatitis C testing and other services. 976 Lenzen Avenue, San Jose, CA 95126 (408) 792-3720 www.GetTestedSCC.org
Additional Enrollment Assistance	PACE Clinic	Includes screening and enrollment in the Ryan White Program and other coverage programs — Medi-Cal, Primary Care Access Program, Healthcare Access Program, premiums assistance.
