Section 12.11 – Bereavement Leave

Leaves of absence with pay shall be granted workers in order that they may discharge the customary obligations arising from the death of a <u>member of their immediate</u> family <u>member</u>. "Immediate fFamily <u>member</u>" shall mean the <u>child, parent, sibling,</u> grandparent, grandchild, domestic partner, parent-in-law, stepparent, son-in-law, daughter-in-law, brother-in-law, sister-in-law, any person living in the immediate household of the worker, and any other family member for whom bereavement leave is required by law. mother, father, grandmother, grandfather, son or daughter of the worker or of the spouse of the worker or of the registered domestic partner of the worker; and the spouse, registered domestic partner, stepparent, son-in-law, daughter-in-law, brother, sister, grandchild, brother-in-law, or sister-in-law of the worker or any person living in the immediate household of the worker. Up to forty (40) hours pay shall be granted which will consist of sixteen (16) hours not charged to any accumulated balance, is authorized if out-of-state travel is required.
